Communication

There are several ways we communicate information to you:

- There is the weekly Newsletter emailed to your nominated address
- The school website has dates [calendar] and information about the school
- The Skool Loop App is used to send you notifications and reminders
- Interviews are held formally twice a year, but you can come by appointment on other occasions
- The school Facebook has events and reminders on it
- An "email to text" system will alert you of any urgent or vital information eg. snow closure, earthquake
- We provide a written 'Progress and Achievement' Report twice a year as well

Please be mindful that while teachers can be emailed directly, communication and requests should generally come through the school office. During the day they have a class to teach and cannot be expected to attend to your messages or requests during this time. Teachers are asked not to deal with emails or texts after 5pm and please allow 24 hours for any teacher to respond.

Launchpad (Christian Education)

The Board will make a decision on the Launchpad values programme for 2021 at its first meeting in late February. If you wish to make a submission, please do so in writing to the Board before 19 Feb. We would like to remind you of the following:

- Attendance at Launchpad is optional. Launchpad is an 'opt in' system and your preference will have been noted at enrolment on the Enrolment Form. The school is 'officially' closed during Christian Education.
- If your child is not attending you have a choice; you may keep them at home until 9.30am when classes start, OR they can be supervised in the Library by one of the teaching staff until 9.30am
- If you wish to re-evaluate any previous decision about attendance (or non-attendance) at Launchpad (Christian Education), please come and see the Principal.
- The programme is delivered through curriculum booklets. These booklets are available on request.

The volunteers / tutors running the programme are all Police Vetted.

ABSENTEES - Notifying the office can be done in several ways, Phone—2048614, Email—office@tapanui.school.nz or in the School App (skool loop) there is an absentee page that has school contact details and you can phone, text or email via this app. The office will then pass information onto your childs' homeroom teacher.

When leaving a message by phone, text or email, please provide the reason for being absent eg sick, doctor, holiday, $Kip\ McGrath$, bereavement etc as this information is recorded.

ARRIVING AT SCHOOL AFTER 9AM - Please report to us at the office if children arrive at school late so rolls can be updated and we can account for their whereabouts.

ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION - If medication is required to be taken during school hours there are forms at the office caregivers are required to complete and sign. Medication will be held at the school office and a record of when and how much medicine has been administered will be kept. Medicine is not to be kept in school bags.

PARENTS AND VISITORS - Please sign the visitors book in the office when first arriving on the school grounds during school hours. This applies when picking children up early or if you're picking them up for an appointment during the day. In the event of any emergency it is important we know who is on site at all times.


